### A Personal Note From Myra

Since 1995 I have been blessed to serve a poor, uneducated, spiritually lost community in Chiquimula, Guatemala. It has been my honor and blessing to have witnessed the hand of God, through His love, transform families in this community and meet their needs. The ministry's focus has been on salvation, family unity, food distribution, school scholarships, adult education, school shoes, water purifiers and replacement filters and eco stoves. We have also strived to break the bonds of poverty through Christ centered counsel. In order to accomplish our goals we need help to pay salaries to our employees and cover expenses such as monthly utilities and building maintenance charges. To meet the communities spiritual, educational , nutritional and health needs the ministry needs \$4,000 USD each month.
