

**Isaiah 9:2. ESV The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.**



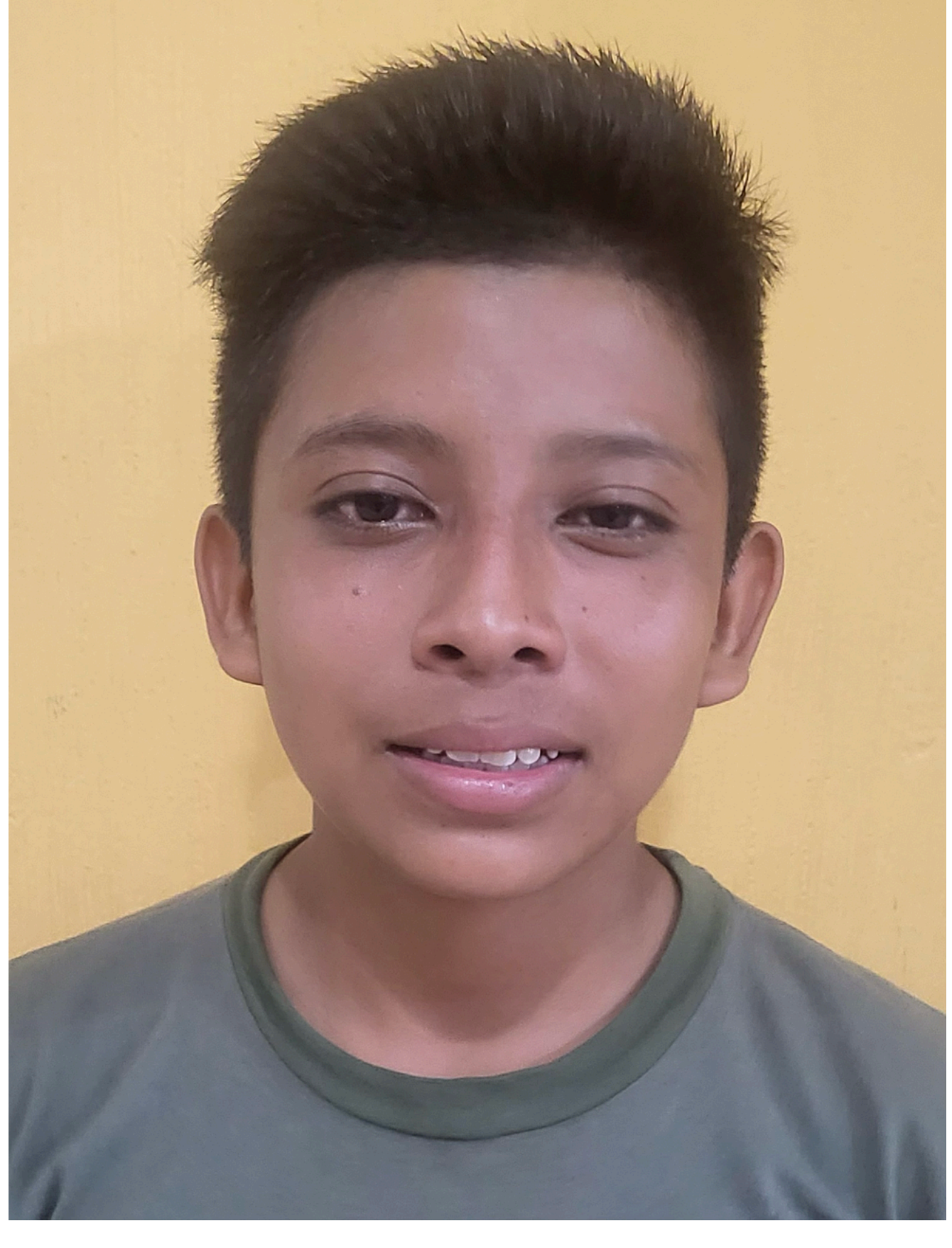

Early in June the first report cards came in for this year. Here are our highest achievers in junior High, senior High and University. We are very proud of our students.

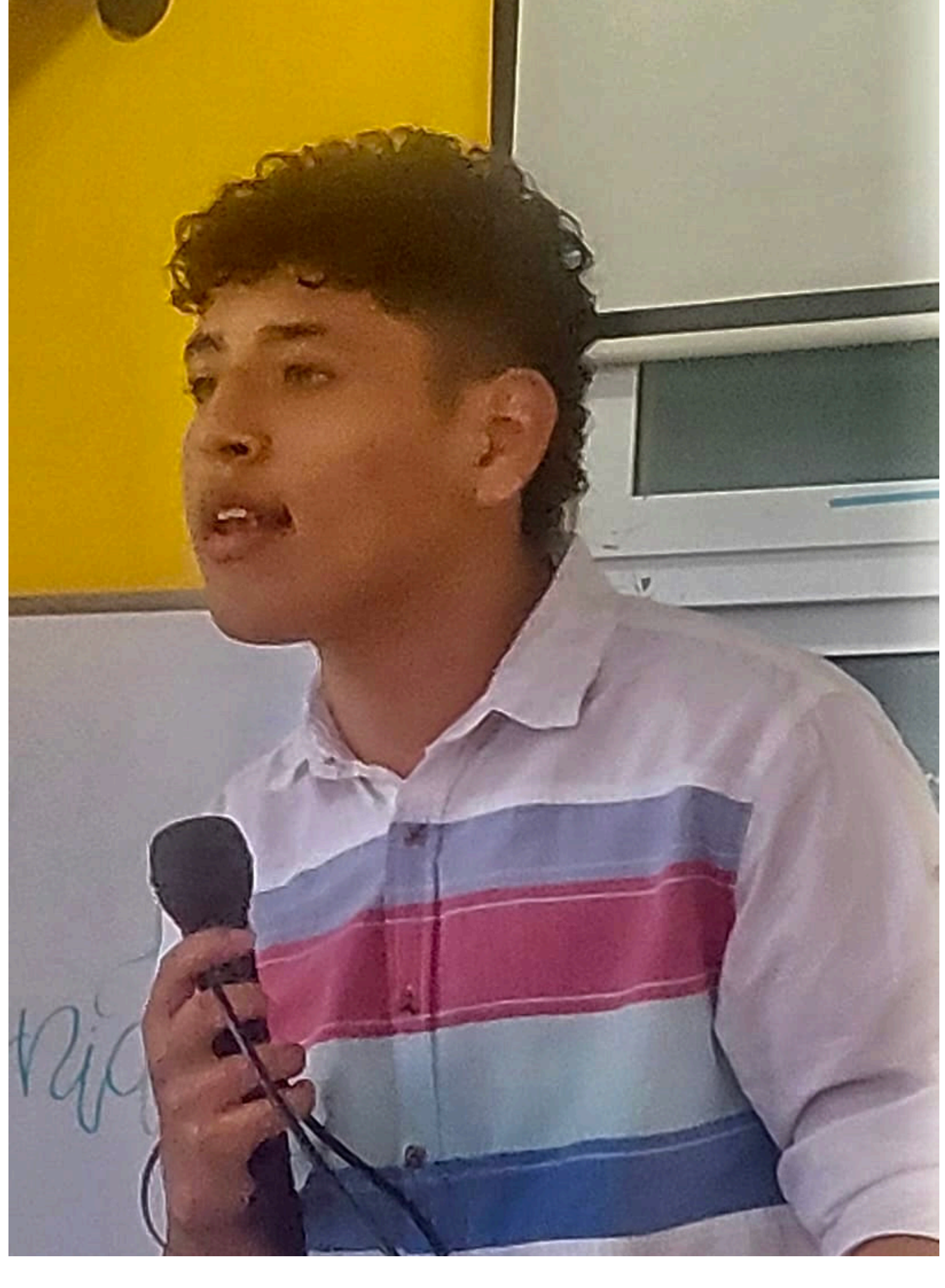
Below is Denis who had a 88% average. He is in the 8th grade
