### A Personal Note From Myra

Since 1995 I have been blessed to serve a poor, uneducated, spiritually lost community in Chiquimula, Guatemala. It has been my honor and blessing to have witnessed the hand of God, through His love, transform families in this community and meet their needs. The ministry's focus has been on salvation, family unity, food distribution, school scholarships, adult education, school shoes, water purifiers and replacement filters and eco stoves. We have also strived to break the bonds of poverty through Christ centered counsel. In order to accomplish our goals we need help to pay salaries to our employees and cover expenses such as monthly utilities and building maintenance charges. To meet the communities spiritual, educational, nutritional and health needs the ministry needs \$4,000 USD each month.

In the 27 years I have spent in Guatemala, I have raised a family including my firstborn Lilith and my two additional gifts, Aimee and Daniel, by my personal retirement income. All donations go directly to the ministry. During this time I have also welcomed a number of grandchildren and great grands. In 2017 I married a wonderful godly man, Mac, who also is in ministry and my biggest supporter. I also support him in his endeavors and travels through his organization Thirst No More Corporation. This takes us to the streets of Baltimore, MD and to foreign countries 6 months out of the year. I am truly blessed that there is excellent support from my staff in Chiquimula, that manage the ministry completely when I am away.



## Guatemalan Board Members

As I am entering my 75th year on this earth, I have to consider the future of the ministry when I can no longer effectively serve. I have been praying about succession and am in the process of forming a Guatemalan non-profit which can oversee such matters. The investment in the future of our ministry will be approximately \$1,400.00 to cover the legal fees in setting up this nonprofit for Guatemala.

I have full confidence the Lord and YOU will provide our need. We are setting our sights on having this amount in full by the end of August so we can pursue the official formation of this organization by September 2022.
